1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Approved Minutes for the regular meeting of the City Council and Housing Authority of March 20, 2018, and the special meeting of the City Council and Housing Authority of March 2, 2018, and the approving same as on file in the Records Management Department.

2. BILLS/PAYROLL

City Council approved **Bills** for the period February 25, 2018 through March 10, 2018, in the amount of \$14,670,114.79 and **Payroll** for the period February 25, 2018 through March 10, 2018, in the amount of \$3,445,505.01, when audited by the Finance Committee.

3. VOTING DELEGATE FOR THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF GOVERNMENTS (SCAG) GENERAL ASSEMBLY

City Council designated Council Member Debra Dorst-Porada as the City's voting delegate for the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) General Assembly scheduled for May 3, 2018.

4. A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE 2018-2019 LIST OF PROJECTS FUNDED BY THE ROAD MAINTENANCE AND REHABILITATION ACCOUNT (SB-1)

City Council adopted a resolution approving the 2018-2019 Project List for the Road Repair and Accountability Act – Senate Bill SB1.

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-033 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ONTARIO, CALIFORNIA, TO APPROVE THE LIST OF PROJECTS TO BE FUNDED BY SB 1 THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT.

5. PASSENGER AMENITY PROGRAM AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ONTARIO AND OMNITRANS FOR THE PASSENGER AMENITY PROGRAM

City Council approved a Passenger Amenity Program Agreement with Omnitrans, of San Bernardino, CA, for the administration of a comprehensive passenger amenities program at bus stops in Ontario; and authorized the City Manager to execute the agreement and future non-substantive amendments during the agreement term.

6. PURCHASE OF MOBILE AND PORTABLE VHF RADIOS FROM COMMLINE, INC.

City Council authorized the purchase of mobile and portable VHF radios and radio programming accessories from Commline, Inc. of Culver City, California, in the amount of \$310,031.

7. AN AMENDED AND RESTATED ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR EXPANDED CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTS AND SERVICES RELATED TO FIRE STATION NO. 9/WLC ARCHITECTS, INC.

City Council authorized the City Manager to execute an Architectural Design Services Agreement that amends agreement PFD14-FS9-001 and restates as D&C18-003-FS9 with WLC Architects, Inc., of Rancho Cucamonga, California, for an amount not to exceed \$250,425, plus a contingency of \$25,042, to complete the design and development of Fire Station No. 9.

8. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL SERVICES CENTER (OMSC) FACILITIES PLAN

City Council approved and authorized the City Manager to execute a Professional Services Agreement with Griffin Structures, Inc. of Irvine, CA, for the Ontario Municipal Services Center (OMSC) Facilities Plan for the amount of \$239,150 plus a 15% contingency of \$35,873 for a total amount of \$275,023.

MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED: Mayor Leon declared City Council Resolution No. 2018-033 unanimously adopted.

City Council introduced and waived further reading of an ordinance initiating the name change of Director of Finance to Executive Director of Finance, and department name change from Department of Administrative Services to Financial Services Agency.

STAFF MATTERS

City Manager Ochoa noted the confirmation of Police Chief Williams at the last City Council meeting, and stated that there had been additional executive staff transitions recently which should be announced. He then acknowledged the promotions of David Sheasby to Deputy City Manager, Scott Murphy to Development Director, Angela Lopez to Director of Human Resources and Helen McAlary to Director of Community Life & Culture. He thanked the City Council for their support of the organizational changes.

COUNCIL MATTERS

Council Member Valencia recognized the Fire unions for their fundraiser golf tournament held the prior week, noting that proceeds went to the Ontario USO. He also stated that to date, Ontario Fire has donated over \$100,000 to the USO to assist in providing services to our military at the airport.

Council Member Bowman shared that the summer schedule for Ontario Town Square activities and events was now available, and he reminded the public of the quality family entertainment coming up. He also noted his attendance at the grand opening of the Whispering Lakes Dog Park. He indicated that it was a nice facility for south Ontario residents and one of three such dog parks in the City.

Mayor pro Tem Wapner discussed the policy issues regarding the importance of maintaining consistent zoning for the Ontario Ranch area as it develops and the desire to assure that shopping centers and other community amenities are built. He requested and received Council concurrence to have a policy discussion for direction from the City Council. Mayor Leon noted that the Council might want to rethink or reconfirm overall development strategies within the Ontario Ranch area.

Council Member Dorst-Porada announced upcoming C.E.R.T. training and encouraged public participation. She also noted the students present at this meeting and offered to stay after the meeting for any dialogue or questions they may have.

ADJOURNMENT

Mayor Leon adjourned the meetings of the Joint Agencies at 6:53 p.m. and announced the next regular meetings to be held on Tuesday, May 1, 2018.
