Ontario by the Numbers HOMELESS SERVICES

The City of Ontario's award-winning continuum of care homelessness services program was established in 2005. Partnering with Mercy House, a local non-profit organization, we take a "wraparound services" approach. This includes homelessness prevention, case management, and finding permanent homes for those in need. We accomplish this by bringing together multiple community partners including local law enforcement, faith-based organizations, and county programs to collectively address the needs of our community.



Housing units are owned and operated as permanent affordable housing units for qualified individuals and families that are experiencing homelessness.



Approximately \$200,000 is generated per year through rental income. This reduces the need for state and federal resources.



\$0 - \$1,450 The average monthly rent range for tenants in affordable housing units. Rental income generated helps fund other critical homeless services.



Since 2014, 68 clients have been permanently housed through the Tenant Based Rental Assistance program.
