### **THE CITY OF ONTARIO PRESENTS DISASTER PREPAREDNESS: #BEINFORMED: EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS JULY 16, 2015**

The Ontario Museum of History and Art is presenting a disaster preparedness program in conjunction with the current temporary exhibit *Alert Today, Alive Tomorrow: Living with the Atomic Bomb, 1945-1965*, now through August 9, 2015. This exhibit explores the ways that Americans experienced the atomic threat as part of their daily lives – at school, in the home, and even at play with more than 75 original objects from the era, as well as large-scale graphics, radio broadcasts, and film.

The first workshop for this exhibit will be **#BE INFORMED: EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS**, presented on Thursday, July 16, 2015 from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM, by City of Ontario Emergency Manager Paul Walker. In this workshop participants will learn how the City of Ontario uses social media tools and other online resources to keep citizens informed in an emergency. Reservations are required.
