Director's Report

Education:

Director Kucheck reported the Museum Education Team participated in two community outreach events, the City of Ontario's Community Open House and Mariposa Elementary School's Open house.

Directed Kucheck reported that on April 7th a Musuem Assistant facilitated her first program "Mindful Art Paint with Us". Where she brought previous teachings from a training at The Getty to the community. This program also utilized the Carlson Education Classroom for the first time.

The second program happened on the last exhibit day of *We the People*, artist Cindita hosted a college workshop allowing individuals to create artwork representing different themes related to the exhibit.

Education's upcoming workshops are the California native plant cookie decorating class in partnership with Dolce Vida by Lised on May 13th and an activity based on *Built on Water* for Culture Fest on May 20th.

The education department hosted both the De Anza community teen podcast team and the City's Library Teen Lab for tours of the museum.

Exhibits:

Director Kucheck reported that the current exhibit *We the People: Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow* closed April 16th, 2023 bringing in over 1,500 visitors during its run.

Upcoming: 12th Ontario Open scheduled for May 18, 2023-July 30,2023

Collection:

Director Kucheck reported that the Collection Team has been prioritizing cleaning multiple artifacts for the *Built on Water* exhibit. She explained staff has cleaned pieces of the fountain, the trolly, and water meters.

The Collection Team is also working on the first phase of wall-to-wall inventory and utilizing more of the offsite storage space.

Other:

Lastly, Director Kucheck reported on phase two of the Musuem's Master Facility Plan. The main topics focused on were: waterproofing, base basement retrofitting & elevator, improvements to exterior spaces to allow for additional program-driven use, the museum store, main hall wall signage, main hall kiosks, old jail, staff and visitor safety, wayfinding, site perimeter improvements, and potential upgrades to the kitchen for larger events.

Liaison Dorst-Porada asked about the roof, and Director Kucheck explained that it is a part of the Museum Master Facility Plan, but these listed items are the newer topics discussed. Director Kucheck also explained the pressing need for more collection storage.

STAFF REPORTS

Culture Fest 2023

Director Kucheck presented on Culture Fest happening on May 20th, 2023. She explained that this is the first year the museum will lead the event and is a part of the Arts and Culture side of the department.

She explained the event will have a focus and theme of water to connect with the new exhibit *Built on Water* and will host a variety of entertainment, vendors, and art. This year's event is in conjunction with the quarterly Art Walks so the museum will be utilizing up lighting, a stage, and DJ to draw a crowd. The museum is excepting about 1,00 people for this event.

The event will host a variety of performance including: a Tonga performance by Motivating Action Leadership Opportunity (M.A.L.O.), a performance by Bob Baker Marionette Theatre, a rendition of Handel's Water Dance by the Southland Symphony's brass quintet, and a performance from Etiwanda High School March Eagle Regiment. Culture Fest will also have performances and volunteer support from the De Anza Teen Studio.

A public art installation entitled "The Glass Wall" by Lucina Abait will be installed the day of the event. "The Glass Wall" is an immersive installation with elements of sound that showcases the idea of water as a resource and what are the realties and metaphors of trying to control it.

Director Kucheck also highlighted the following elements of the event:

- Multiple food trucks on Lemon Street
- Ten different artist vendors
- DJ
- Open art galleries
- Using the Carlson education classroom as a green room for performers
