City of Ontario's Notice of Preparation of a Supplemental Environmental Impact Report for the Guasti Plaza Specific Plan Amendment (PSPA 08-006); SCH# 2008111072

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), Division of Aeronautics (Division), reviewed the above-referenced document with respect to airport-related noise and safety impacts and regional aviation land use planning issues pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The Division has technical expertise in the areas of airport operations safety, noise and airport land use compatibility. We are a funding agency for airport projects and we have permit authority for publicuse and special-use airports and heliports.

The proposed amendment will allow for residential uses, a maximum of 500 multiple-family dwelling units on approximately 13.18 acres on the eastern, southeastern, and western portions of the Specific Plan area. The project site is located approximately 2,200 feet north of the Ontario International Airport. According to the Notice of Preparation, since "permanent residents would be introduced on-site by the proposed Amendment," airport hazards and noise impacts would be addressed further in the Supplemental Environmental Impact Report.

In addition, the proposal must not result in hazards to flight, such as:

- Obstructions to the navigable airspace (i.e. Federal Aviation Regulations Part 77 defined primary, approach and transitional surfaces) required for flight to, from, and around an airport
- Visual hazards associated with distracting lights, glare, and sources of smoke
- Electronic hazards that may interfere with aircraft instruments or radio communication

State Public Utilities Code Section 21659 prohibits structural hazards near airports. Depending on proposed structural heights and in accordance with Federal Aviation Regulation, Part 77 "Objects Affecting Navigable Airspace" a Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration (Form 7460-1) may be required by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Form 7460-1 is available on-line at <a href="https://oeaaa.faa.gov/oeaaa/external/portal.jsp">https://oeaaa.faa.gov/oeaaa/external/portal.jsp</a> and should be submitted electronically to the FAA.

The protection of airports from incompatible land use encroachment is vital to California's economic future. Ontario International Airport is an economic asset that should be protected through effective airport land use compatibility planning and awareness. Although the need for compatible and safe land uses near airports is both a local and State issue, airport staff, airport land use commissions and

airport land use compatibility plans are key to protecting an airport and the people residing and working in the vicinity of an airport. Consideration given to the issue of compatible land uses in the vicinity of an airport should help to relieve future conflicts between airports and their neighbors.

These comments reflect the areas of concern to the Division with respect to airport-related noise and safety impacts and regional airport land use planning issues. We advise you to contact our Caltrans District 8 office concerning surface transportation issues.

Guasti Plaza Specific Plan Amendment (PSPA 08-006)

Dear Mr. Ayala:

I am in receipt of your Notice of Preparation for an amendment to the Guasti Plaza project to allow residential development within the Specific Plan area. A maximum of 500 dwelling units would be allowed in Planning Areas 2 and 3, which consists of approximately 13 acres at the eastern and southeastern section of the Specific Plan area. The density will range from 45-60 units per acre. The majority of the housing units will include studio, one-bedroom and two-bedroom units ranging in size from 700 to 1000 square feet. The residential structures will vary in height, from three to five stories. Based on the map provided, the project area appears to be in the vicinity of the LA/Ontario International Airport.

It is necessary under Part 77 of the Federal Aviation Regulations to notify the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) of any proposal which would exceed certain elevations with respect to the ground and neighboring airports.

CFR Title 14 Part 77.13 states that any person/organization who intends to sponsor any of the following construction or alterations must notify the Administrator of the FAA:

- any construction or alteration exceeding 200 ft above ground level
- any construction or alteration:
- within 20,000 ft of a public use or military airport which exceeds a 100:1 surface from any point on the runway of each airport with at least one runway more than 3,200 ft
- within 10,000 ft of a public use or military airport which exceeds a 50:1 surface from any point on the runway of each airport with its longest runway no more than 3,200 ft
- within 5,000 ft of a public use heliport which exceeds a 25:1 surface

- any highway, railroad or other traverse way whose prescribed adjusted height would exceed that above noted standards when requested by the FAA
- any construction or alteration located on a public use airport or heliport regardless of height or location.

To fulfill this requirement, it is necessary to complete and return a copy of the Form 7460-1, Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration. This form is found on the web at: <a href="http://torms.faa.gcv/forms/faa7460-1.par">http://torms.faa.gcv/forms/faa7460-1.par</a>. Once completed please forward the 7460-1, and any related plans for obstruction evaluation to:

Or coordinate with FAA's Western-Pacific Region System Obstruction Specialist Karen McDonald to address any potential air space obstruction issues. Ms. McDonald may be contacted at 310-725-6557 or karen.mcdonald@faa.gov.

Additionally, the FAA has the following comments:

- The FAA must object to a residential development project that would place homes so close to the airport.
- The drawings provided in the NOC do not portray the airport or airport runway layout in proximity to the proposed development other than a reference in the General Aviation section.
- The residential development is located approximately three-quarter of a mile north of ONT with the proposed development lying adjacent to the approach and departure pattern of Runways 8L/26R.
- The presence of residential units in proximity to and from the airport will in all likelihood generate complaints from homeowners as well as engender hostility towards the airport
- The FAA recommends that the City choose zoning criteria for the property other than residential use will be compatible with the airport
- A substantial permanent increase in ambient noise levels in the project vicinity above levels existing without the project
- The presence of residential units in close proximity to and adjacent to the approach and departure of the airport will in all likelihood generate noise complaints from homeowners for which the City must contend with. Additionally, with airport growth there is potential for noise levels to exceed the 65 dB CNEL level at the project site.
- The City should be aware that residential neighborhoods affected by airport noise might create additional cost for the City associated with noise abatement measures that are adopted to mitigate noise created by close proximity to the airport.

- Real estate disclosures should be developed advising homebuyers there's an airport that operates on a 24-hour basis next to the home that will have aircraft causing noise on the airport, during approach and departure and in the airspace above the home.
- The homeowner should be made to sign a covenant pledging not to litigate because the home is in an airport noise impact area.
- The building code should require that the homes be built with noise insulation, acoustically treated windows, doors, and central heating and air conditioning.
- The deed conveying the property should contain an avigation easement granting a right to make noise and exhaust in the airspace of the homes.
- Be aware that mitigation measures will not eliminate noise. Homeowners will still be exposed to noise because aircraft will continue to cause noise in the airspace above the homes. Furthermore, sensitivity to noise is an individual matter. Some people are more sensitive to noise than others. Therefore, all the sound attenuation in the world will not eliminate the potential annoyance that individuals experience from noise.

Dear Mr. Ayala:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Notice of Preparation for the above referenced project. Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) operates LA/Ontario International Airport (ONT) directly south of the project site and the City of Ontario has been a very cooperative and important stakeholder in ensuring the viability of this economic asset in the Inland Empire. LAWA is concerned regarding the proposal to allow new residential development so close to ONT.

As stated in the NOP, the current 65 dB CNEL noise contour for ONT extends into the project area. By 2030, the noise contour will most likely expand. Over the last 50 years, most airports in the country have been struggling to mitigate the impacts of noise on residential communities in the vicinity of their airports. Mitigation efforts and the need to purchase homes and relocate families as airports have grown have cost billions of dollars, created hardship on established communities and kept many airports from reaching their full potential to provide air service to the region. The costs and risks of allowing new residential uses in existing noise impacted areas should be carefully considered.

LAWA is very interested in reviewing the Draft Environmental Impact Report (EiR) and its analysis on noise impacts on residential uses. Our Quarterly Airport Impact Area maps showing the noise contours for ONT and the affected land uses are available for your use to complete your analysis. You can obtain a copy through our Noise Management Section or view them on our website. In addition, future year noise model runs have been done which can provide information on long term noise impacts.

In addition to noise, the Draft EIR should include a discussion on the residential quality of life in the vicinity of the airport, including the use of open space; hazards from aircraft emissions; and impacts on air commerce, including growth in air cargo operations. It is also important that both the FAA and Caltrans Division of

Aeronautics be consulted regarding land use and safety issues. The FAA has recently changed instrument approach procedures at ONT in preparation for the use of GPS based landing systems. These changes may impact land use and height restrictions.

I apologize for the late response to your NOP and hope that it is not too late for you to consider these issues in the preparation of the Draft EIR. Thank you for contacting the Morongo Band of Mission Indians regarding the above referenced project(s). The Tribe greatly appreciates the opportunity to review the project and, respectfully, offer the following comment(s):

- o If human remains are encountered during grading and other construction excavation, work in the immediate vicinity shall cease and the County Coroner shall be contacted pursuant to State Health and Safety Code §7050.5.
- o In the event that Native American cultural resources are discovered during project development/construction, all work in the immediate vicinity of the find shall cease and a qualified archaeologist meeting Secretary of Interior standards shall be hired to assess the find. Work on the overall project may continue during this assessment period.
- If significant Native American cultural resources are discovered, for which a Treatment Plan must be prepared, the developer or his archaeologist shall contact the Morongo Band of Mission Indians ("Tribe"). If requested by the Tribe, the developer or the project archaeologist shall, in good faith, consult on the discovery and its disposition (e.g. avoidance, preservation, return of artifacts to tribe, etc.).

Thank you for your Notice of Preparation to do an Environmental Assessment for the Guasti Plaza Specific Plan Amendment. Omnitrans supports the plan amendment to add residential units to the Guasti Specific Plan Area. Intensified land uses around transit stations and corridors are recommended. We look forward to working with you and your client to improve this Specific Planning Area and to deliver efficient mobility options for the community.

This project may also want consider some other important transit developments for the City of Ontario such as the proposed Metro Gold Line extension and the California high-speed rail station. This project is in fairly close proximity to the future stations.

- 1. Service Area: Omnitrans currently serves the Guasti Plaza Specific Planning Area.
- 2. **Existing Bus Routes:** The Guasti Plaza Specific Planning Area is served by route 61 on Archibald Avenue, with 15-minute frequencies. Bus Stops are located on Archibald Avenue, on the far sides of the New Guasti Road Intersection.
- 3. **Existing Capacity:** Route 61 has above standard performance, at 27.7 passengers per revenue hour. It is the busiest route in the system.
- 4. **Future Expansion:** The Guasti Plaza Specific Planning Area could see increased transit service to it, if the intensities of land uses in the Planning Area warrant it.
- 5. Project Infrastructure needs:
  - **a. Bus Turnouts-** Turnouts are necessary for busses on the far side of New Guasti Road on Archibald Avenue (Northbound and southbound).

- **b.** Bus Stop Amenities In order to better accommodate existing and future riders at the site, the following amenities are requested at the bus stops:
  - i. Passenger Landing Areas
  - ii. Pedestrian Connections
  - iii. Curb Ramps
  - iv. Shelters with lighting
  - v. Bus Benches
  - vi. Trash Receptacles
- c. Pedestrian Traffic Signals- A signalized pedestrian crosswalk is needed at the New Guasti Road and Archibald Avenue intersection to address passenger safety to and from the bus stops from the Specific Plan Area.
- 6. Impacts and Mitigation: The impacts upon transit associated with the increase in population and activity in the Specific Plan area could be mitigated with increased bus trip frequencies and services. The infrastructure items mentioned in #5 should be considered as recommended transit impact mitigation measures.

The planned Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) corridor for San Bernardino Avenue could provide additional transit service improvements. The infrastructure items mentioned in #5 would also help to accommodate a future BRT route.







Archibald Northbound




Archibald Southbound

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above-referenced project.

The County of San Bernardino Solid Waste Management Division is responsible for the management and oversight of all County landfill and waste transfer operations. As such, we would request that the following issues be addressed in the Guasti Plaza Specific Plan Amendment:

- The creation of a new waste stream with this development and its impact on existing landfill capacity and traffic (Information provided should include waste generation pre and post construction, estimated tonnage, existing approved tonnage at receiving landfill(s), potential increase in traffic at development site [creation of new streets], traffic to the landfill itself, etc.);
- Requirements for handling recycling, construction and demolition debris (Information should include existing recycling programs);
- Whether any hazardous waste will be generated, and, if so, types and quantities, including proposed disposal method(s) (Information should address pre and post construction; i.e., will any hazardous materials be used during demolition and/or construction and the types/quantities of hazardous waste expected after project completion);
- Availability of commercial waste haulers and expected increases in traffic due to expanded hauler routes to serve the proposed development.

# Notice of Preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Report (Draft EIR) for the Guasti Plaza Specific Plan Amendment

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) appreciates the opportunity to comment on the above-mentioned document. The SCAQMD's comments are recommendations regarding the analysis of potential air quality impacts from the proposed project that should be included in the draft environmental impact report (EIR). Please send the SCAQMD a copy of the Draft EIR upon its completion. In addition, please send with the draft EIR all appendices or technical documents related to the air quality analysis and electronic versions of all air quality modeling and health risk assessment files. Electronic files include spreadsheets, database files, input files, output files, etc., and does <u>not</u> mean Adobe PDF files. Without all files and supporting air quality documentation, the SCAQMD will be unable to complete its review of the air quality analysis in a timely manner. Any delays in providing all supporting air quality documentation will require additional time for review beyond the end of the comment period.

#### Air Quality Analysis

The SCAQMD adopted its California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Air Quality Handbook in 1993 to assist other public agencies with the preparation of air quality analyses. The SCAQMD recommends that the Lead Agency use this Handbook as guidance when preparing its air quality analysis. Copies of the Handbook are available from the SCAQMD's Subscription Services Department by calling (909) 396-3720. Alternatively, the lead agency may wish to consider using the California Air Resources Board (CARB) approved URBEMIS 2007 Model. This model is available on the SCAQMD Website at: <a href="www.urbemis.com">www.urbemis.com</a>.

The Lead Agency should identify any potential adverse air quality impacts that could occur from all phases of the project and all air pollutant sources related to the project. Air quality impacts from both construction (including demolition, if any) and operations should be calculated. Construction-related air quality impacts typically include, but are not limited to, emissions from the use of heavy-duty equipment from grading, earth-loading/unloading, paving, architectural coatings, off-road mobile sources (e.g., heavy-duty construction equipment) and on-road mobile sources (e.g., construction worker vehicle trips, material transport trips). Operation-related air quality impacts may include, but are not limited to, emissions from stationary sources (e.g., boilers), area sources (e.g., solvents and coatings), and vehicular trips (e.g., on- and off-road tailpipe emissions and entrained dust). Air quality impacts from indirect sources, that is, sources that generate or attract vehicular trips should be included in the analysis.

The SCAQMD has developed a methodology for calculating PM2.5 emissions from construction and operational activities and processes. In connection with developing PM2.5 calculation methodologies, the SCAQMD has also developed both regional and localized significance thresholds. The SCAQMD requests that the lead agency quantify PM2.5 emissions and compare the results to the recommended PM2.5 significance thresholds. Guidance for calculating PM2.5 emissions and PM2.5 significance thresholds can be found at the following internet address: http://www.aqmd.gov/ceqa/handbook/PM2\_5/PM2\_5.html.

In addition to analyzing regional air quality impacts the SCAQMD recommends calculating localized air quality impacts and comparing the results to localized significance thresholds (LSTs). LST's can be used in addition to the recommended regional significance thresholds as a second indication of air quality impacts when preparing a CEQA document. Therefore, when preparing the air quality analysis for the proposed project, it is recommended that the lead agency perform a localized significance analysis by either using the LSTs developed by the SCAQMD or performing dispersion modeling as necessary. Guidance for performing a localized air quality analysis can be found at <a href="http://www.aqmd.gov/ceqa/handbook/LST/LST.html">http://www.aqmd.gov/ceqa/handbook/LST/LST.html</a>.

It is recommended that lead agencies for projects generating or attracting vehicular trips, especially heavy-duty diesel-fueled vehicles, perform a mobile source health risk assessment. Guidance for performing a mobile source health risk assessment ("Health Risk Assessment Guidance for Analyzing Cancer Risk from Mobile Source Diesel Idling Emissions for CEQA Air Quality Analysis") can be found on the SCAQMD's CEQA web pages at the following internet address: <a href="http://www.aqmd.gov/ceqa/handbook/mobile\_toxic/mobile\_toxic.html">http://www.aqmd.gov/ceqa/handbook/mobile\_toxic/mobile\_toxic.html</a>. An analysis of all toxic air contaminant impacts due to the decommissioning or use of equipment potentially generating such air pollutants should also be included.

#### Mitigation Measures

In the event that the project generates significant adverse air quality impacts, CEQA requires that all feasible mitigation measures that go beyond what is required by law be utilized during project construction and operation to minimize or eliminate significant adverse air quality impacts. To assist the Lead Agency with identifying possible mitigation measures for the project, please refer to Chapter 11 of the SCAQMD CEQA Air Quality Handbook for sample air quality mitigation measures. Additional mitigation measures can be found on the SCAQMD's CEQA web pages at the following internet address: <a href="https://www.aqmd.gov/ceqa/handbook/mitigation/MM\_intro.html">www.aqmd.gov/ceqa/handbook/mitigation/MM\_intro.html</a> Additionally, SCAQMD's Rule 403 – Fugitive Dust, and the Implementation Handbook contain numerous measures for controlling construction-related emissions that should be considered for use as CEQA mitigation if not otherwise required. Other measures to reduce air quality impacts from land use projects can be found in the SCAQMD's Guidance Document for Addressing Air Quality Issues in General Plans and Local Planning.
