COMMENTS:

OVITT: Ovitt expressed his thanks to Ken Dean and stating that he has always been a stable influence on the Commission and is well respected throughout the

community. Mr. Ovitt congratulated Ken on becoming a Planning Commissioner.

BINNEY: Binney stated that Ken Dean was so welcoming to him when he joined the

Commission. Ken served as a gracious representative of the citizens of Ontario.

NELSEN: Nelsen stated how much she enjoyed working with Ken Dean on the Commission

over the years. She shared that he brought comfort and stability and has always been so welcoming to everyone. He kept things in perspective, and she thanked

him for being their leader and their friend.

TRINIDAD: Trinidad thanked Ken for always being a comfort not only to the Commission but on a personal level offering career and family advice. Trinidad stated that Ken

will be greatly missed and wished him good luck on his new endeavor.

CASKEY: Caskey stated that Ken welcomed him when he recently joined the Commission.

He is a consummate professional.

MACIAS: Thanked Ken for his dedication to this city that is so precious to us all.

RILEY: Riley stated that she and Ken joined the Commission at the same time and that

she has always enjoyed working with him over the years and wished him luck.

DEPARTMENT REPORT:

4. <u>Recreation & Community Services</u> – Nicholas Gonzalez, Recreation & Community Services Director, narrated a PowerPoint presentation on department highlights of program activities that occurred in June 2021.

OLD BUSINESS

5. Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Departmental Budget Update & Organization Chart – Nicholas Gonzalez, Recreation & Community Services Director presented a presentation to the Commission on the approved Fiscal Year 2021-2022 budget for the Recreation & Community Services Department. Gonzalez's presentation included budget details regarding programming and staff. This also included department goals for this upcoming fiscal year.

COMMENTS:

CASKEY: Asked if our staff can confirm the process of accounting for the attendance numbers for the Whispering Lakes Golf Course.

GONZALEZ: Stated that he will inquire with the operators of Whispering Lakes Golf Course and find out how they calculate and track their attendance numbers.

NELSEN: Nelsen talked about the new homes in Ontario Ranch and asked if our programming is currently being promoted in the New Haven and Park Place developments. She stated that the last time she attended a concert at Ontario Town Square she spent time talking with residents and confirmed that many of them are coming from that area of Ontario.

GONZALEZ: Confirmed that all residents in those areas are receiving the Ontario Living magazine each month. Our department is currently planning more outreach to that area.

OVITT: Mr. Ovitt stated that the entrance to Whispering Lakes Golf Course is not looking very good. There is a lot of land there and hopes that it will start to get more attention.

GONZALEZ: Gonzalez stated that part of our goal this year is to work with the operator of Whispering Lakes Golf Course as much as we can and come up with ways to enhance their programming which can increase their revenue and enhance the grounds of the golf course.

OVITT: Ovitt asked about the condition and preservation of Jay Littleton Ball Park.

GONZALEZ: Responded that Jay Littleton Ball Park is on our list for future renovation and the Department is working with Historic Preservation in the Planning Department.

TRINIDAD: Asked about the park attendants that were mentioned in the budget presentation. He asked if they will be assigned to monitor all our parks or just certain ones.

GONZALEZ: Park Attendants will monitor all our parks, especially those with reservations to make sure operations are running smoothly and that all field use is permitted.

NEW BUSINESS

6. Emergency Senior Meals Program and Ontario Senior Center Update – Tracee Davis, Senior Recreation & Community Services Supervisor and Marquita Hester, Senior Recreation Leader presented a presentation of the Emergency Senior Meals Program that the Recreation & Community Services Department provided from April 2020 through June 2021.

COMMENTS:

BINNEY: Binney stated he has worked as a volunteer with the Ontario Senior Center for over 20 years. He stated that the compassion and humanity for the community that staff shows towards our seniors always amazes him, especially during this challenging time.

NELSEN: Nelsen stated that the enthusiasm, love and concern for our community and its

seniors is amazing.

RILEY: Stated that the cover sheet from agenda summary shows that from April 1, 2020

through June 4, 2020, Ontario city staff delivered 141,000 meals to the community. The daily deliveries and personal contact were so helpful and that

the seniors appreciated it.

Munoz Community Center.

- SR5-5 Promotion of Ontario Artists and Musicians. We promote awareness of entertainment and culture produced in Ontario.


